## TREE DEDICATION PROJECT

### Background Information:

There are and have been a number of individuals and groups from the Latrobe Municipality who have contributed greatly to the community. An opportunity now exists for families and friends to recognise these efforts by purchasing and dedicating a tree to be located within the Latrobe Community Cemetery grounds.

A Latrobe Council Tree Dedication Working Group has been formed and the placement of the tree would be discussed with the donor(s) and considered by the working group.

### Guidelines:

- (a) To achieve uniformity any one of the following 3 varieties may be selected. The cost will be \$300.00 plus GST = \$330.00 which includes the tree, a brass plaque (measuring is 152mm x 152mm) which allows a maximum of 140 characters and installation.

#### Blackwood Tree

Blackwood is a member of the wattle family and a hardwood. It occurs throughout Tasmania's native forests.

#### Silver Birch

Silver Birch Tree has a white trunk, pendulous habit and glittering leaves.

#### Ornamental Pear

The Ornamental Pear tree is a deciduous species of pear native to China and Vietnam. Leaves are generally oval, long, and glossy dark green in colour. They produce white flowers like blossom.

- (b) The tree's plaque engraving may be: "Sponsored by", "Donated by", "In Memory of" or any other lead is accepted by the Working Group.
- (c) Payment in full must be made prior to Council ordering and installing the tree and plaque.
- (d) Tree placement will be in consultation with the Council Tree Dedication Working Group.
- (e) If a tree is damaged beyond repair, replacement is at total cost and discretion of the donor(s). Council will not be responsible for plaque replacement.
- (f) Upon planting the tree will become Council property and be maintained as part of Council's parks and reserves program.
- (g) Council will coordinate and manage the project.

A register of the trees, including a brief summary of the dedication, will be included on Latrobe Council's web page and updated as required.
